The Spring Show was a huge success both in attendance (355 visitors from 17 states) and in sales (\$1,628.00) with 10% being given back to MDAL. The sales represented all sizes of art although the majority were 12 x 12's. We are suggesting that the new Board plan something similar for our Winter Show at the Congregational Church during the first weekend in December 2015; plus, we are thinking that we will discontinue the Silent Auction so that money is spent on the artwork instead.

We encourage the artists who won ribbons to hang their work for a month in October at Waterman Village; if you sold all your work during our Spring Show, you can make substitutions. We will not have a show for other artists there this October as we did last year.

The Mount Dora Center for the Arts will host a 90th Birthday Party for us with a show from February 26 - March 6, 2016. This marks a new beginning in co-operation between the two organizations which had been non-existent in recent years. We are quite excited about this.

Please send us any fund-raising ideas you may have about art related activities that can fund our monetary gifts to the schools.

We as a Board representing you, our members, appreciate the

hard work, dedication, and time which was given by three retiring members of the Board: David Levee, Past-President; Ronni Bell, Treasurer; and Laini Panuska, Secretary. Take the time to send them a thank you!

I have thirty  $12 \times 12$  frames for \$6.00 each which will be available for you to purchase at the April meeting in preparation for the Winter Show. Carrie will take orders for the wooden boxes at that time, too, for \$9.00 each. The extra dollar on each will go into our funds for the schools.

Well, I like big as well, yet I had raised my hand to accept the challenge so I poked through photographs to find inspiration. Found one that "told a story" and I began early in February to paint a 12x12 canvas. Hours and days and starting over three times let me know this work would be NFS if I even entered it.

Meanwhile, I attended my first workshop on abstract art. Maybe at least I could "go non-objective" and cover my 12x12 canvas with radiance. At home that same evening I began to swirl colors and shapes on a large canvas, freeing my spirit. Three a.m. found me still happily engaged. In the next few days I had completed four 12x12's in sentimental splashes of abstract art, each with its own special meaning for me.

March arrived. Show time! And what a show. Different. Dramatic. All of you who rose to the challenge brought newness, excitement, exotic art. Sales culminated in \$1,628. Unheard of in the 89-year history of our League. We all should be proud of ourselves.

My experience with 12x12 went beyond mere experiment. It became a discovery of pure joy.
