This first book published in **2010**, <u>THE ATHENA PROJECT</u>, is a thriller by Brad Thor who wrote <u>BLOWBACK</u>, which is recognized by *NPR* as one of the "100 Best Thrillers of All Time" and Thor is heralded by *Chicago Tribune* as "quite possibly the next coming of Robert Ludlum." James Rollins of *New York Times* states this book is "a thriller both men and women will love." Brad Thor claims that every weapon, advanced technology, espionage and covert operation strategies mentioned in this book are in actual use today in the military and the government. This information alone is an eye -opener, to say nothing of the intricacies of the plot involved or the secrets kept by the U. S. government!

In summary of the book, Delta Force, the world's most elite counterterrorism unit has a new top-secret, all-female program codenamed The Athena Project to take on one of the nation's deadliest assignments, following a grisly discovery in the jungles of South America.

Read this book. You may think this has to be science fiction, especially given the date of this writing/publication, or maybe I have been sequestered too long and not aware of what is out there in our world. Technology by now must have surpassed even what is described in this book! Is pretty scary to think about us having this kind of technology, let alone opposing forces throughout the world!

THE ART FORGER by B. A. Shapiro is a gripping fiction based on the real-life yet unsolved mysterious robbery March 18,1990 at the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum in Boston. Thirteen works, including Rembrandts, a Vermeer and five Degas drawings were taken and never seen in public since. Shapiro's exciting novel raises timeless questions about authenticity and the true value of art, and includes key plot twists that are genuinely unexpected. Forgery techniques, museum politics, and the contemporary art world are all explored and heavily researched with access to the actual correspondence between Isabella Gardner and her art historian/ agent Bernard Berenson, dozens of interviews with artists, gallery owners, museum experts and lawyers to get true facts. This book is a compelling literary thriller weaving together three stories: Artist Claire Roth's present-day adventures, her disastrous love affair in the recent past with a prominent artist and the strange actual life events at the Gardner Museum back in the 19th Century.

Want to become more involved in the Mount Dora Art League?



David, we will miss your gentle spirit, your wonderful dry wit and the sight of you, sunning yourself in a beach chair with a favorite book in hand.





SHORT HISTORY OF MOUNT DORA-EUSTIS ART LEAGUE

The Mount Dora Art League was founded February 26, 1926. Amon those instrumental in its inception were Mrs. Myra Houghton, Mrs. Man garet Spencer Davidson, Miss Middred Marsh and Mr. Gordon, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce Much interest was shown. Twenty four members were present at the second meeting.

The avowed object of the Leagues was the promotion of art studamong its members and the encouragement of art interest in the correction.

munity.

The monthly craft or work meetings have included sketching, drawing from still life and model, clay molding pottery, tie and dye, bastik, block printing, book binding, soap carving, directed chiefly by Mrs. Davidson until her untimely death in 1932. Later we were fortunate in having Mr. Gallie as teacher.

One year the work period was devoted to making tied and dyed curtains for the social room of the Community Building. At present Mr. Charles Shaw, of Eustis, is leader of a sketch class on Tuesday afternoons and meetings are held evenings for drawing from model and still life.

Successful exhibitions have been held each year (with one exception) and we have had a few traveling exhibits.

In the effort to stimulate are interest among the school children, exhibits of their work have been included in some of our exhibitions. One year a prize was offered the school children for the best poster advertising our exhibition.

The League has observed National Art Week for several years by placing paintings by members in store windows. In 1938, through Mr. Gallie's efforts, National Art Week received county - wide observance, thereby winning for the League an Award for Distinguished Participation from the American Artists Professional League. The same year Mr. Gallie secured space at the Lake County Fair for an Art League Exhibit.

Unfortunately pressure of work forced Mr. Gallie to resign in 1940 and Mr. Walter J. Patton, former student at the Chicago Art Institute, became president and is an active leader. He has recently instituted a competition in the schools of Lake County for a patriotic poster. Mr Patton is a sculptor.


